#### School Responsibilities

### Magnolia School will:

- 1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:
  - The administration will work diligently to secure the most effective teachers who demonstrate a commitment to student learning. All teachers will be highly qualified in the appropriate area to teach our students. Standards for Success will be used to support teachers in becoming master instructors. Professional development will focus on areas of need as determined through observations, self-assessment, and student achievement data.
  - Research-Based Reading instruction will be provided in a manner outlined by best practices through the Alabama Reading Initiative. ARI support personnel will be utilized to ensure all teachers have a firm grasp of supporting student mastery in becoming skillful readers
  - Research-Based Math instruction will be provided in a manner outlined by best practices through EnVision Curriculum
  - Response to Instruction (RTI) will be implemented to support student mastery of grade level standards in all academic areas. Students will be monitored on how well they reach mastery of objectives in mathematics and reading. Supports will be provided for differentiated learning through teachers' conscious efforts to include a variety of strategies and methods of teaching to meet the needs of all students. Intervention will be provided to support classroom instruction in math and reading. Students will receive additional support and time on task to meet appropriate standards if adequate progress is not made in reading and math. Intervention teachers will be provided during school to students who fall below 70% mastery in reading or math.

- All students living in homes with multiple languages will receive support in attaining English language skills through the use of master EL teachers and paraprofessionals.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:
  - Semi-Annual Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held in the Fall and Spring to discuss student progress and review all supports available to help student reach his/her fullest potential.
  - Annual Title 1 Parent Meeting 09/20/22 to inform parents of the Title 1 requirements, Magnolia School's participation in the program, and the rights of parental involvement.
  - Parent-Teacher conferences are highly encouraged for all students not making adequate progress toward grade level standards and will be held as needed throughout the year before, during, and/or after school as can be arranged with parents.
  - Meetings/conferences may be held in person or virtually through GOOGLE MEET to allow flexible scheduling for parents.

  - Meetings/conferences may be held in person or virtually through GOOGLE MEET. This allows for flexible scheduling for parents.
