3 To amend Sections 16-28B-1, 16-28B-2, 16-28B-3, 4 16-28B-4, and 16-28B-5, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the 5 prevention of student bullying; to include student against 6 student bullying, intimidation, violence, and threats of violence off of school property; to redefine harassment as 8 bullying; to specifically include cyberbullying in the 9 definition of bullying; and to change the name of the act to 10 the Jamari Terrell Williams Act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

12 Section 1. Sections 16-28B-1, 16-28B-2, 16-28B-3, 16-28B-4, and 16-28B-5 of the Code of Alabama 1975, are 13 amended to read as follows:

15 "§16-28B-1.

> "This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the Student Harassment Prevention Act Jamari Terrell Williams Student Bullying Prevention Act.

"\$16-28B-2.

"It is the intent of the Legislature to provide for the adoption of policies in public school systems to prevent the harassment bullying of students. It is the further intent of the Legislature that this chapter apply only to student against student harassment bullying, intimidation, violence, and threats of violence in the public schools of Alabama, and between students while not on school property, in grades prekindergarten through 12, and that the State Department of Education develop, and each local board of education adopt procedural policies to manage and possibly prevent these acts against any student by another student or students based on the characteristics of a student.

"Additionally, it is the intent of the Legislature that the filing of a complaint of harassment bullying be in writing and submitted by the affected student, or the parent or guardian of the affected student, and not by an education employee on behalf of an affected student or his or her parent or guardian.

"§16-28B-3.

"The following terms have the following meanings:

"(1) DEPARTMENT. The State Department of Education.

"(2) HARASSMENT. A continuous pattern of intentional

(1) BULLYING. A continuous pattern of intentional behavior that takes place on or off of school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored function including, but not limited to, cyberbullying or written, electronic, verbal, or physical acts that are reasonably perceived as being motivated by any characteristic of a student, or by the association of a student with an individual who has a particular characteristic, if the characteristic falls into one of the categories of personal characteristics contained in

_	the model policy adopted by the department of by a local
2	board, and implemented at each school. To constitute
3	harassment bullying, a pattern of behavior may do any of the
4	following:
5	"a. Place a student in reasonable fear of harm to
6	his or her person or damage to his or her property.
7	"b. Have the effect of substantially interfering
8	with the educational performance, opportunities, or benefits
9	of a student.
10	"c. Have the effect of substantially disrupting or
11	interfering with the orderly operation of the school, whether
12	the conduct occurs on or off school property, online, or
13	electronically.
14	"d. Have the effect of creating a hostile
15	environment in the school, on or off of school property, on a
16	school bus, or at a school-sponsored function.
17	"e. Have the effect of being sufficiently severe,
18	persistent, or pervasive enough to create an intimidating,
19	threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student.
20	"(2) DEPARTMENT. The State Department of Education.
21	"(3) HOSTILE ENVIRONMENT. The perception by an
22	affected student or victim that the conduct of another student
23	constitutes a threat of violence or harassment bullying and
24	that the conduct is objectively severe or pervasive enough
25	that a reasonable person, under the circumstances, would agree

Τ.	that the conduct constitutes harassment bullying, threat of
2	assault, or assault.
3	"(4) LOCAL BOARD. A city or county board of
4	education.
5	"(5) SCHOOL. Each public school, grades
6	prekindergarten through 12, the Alabama Institute for Deaf and
7	Blind, the Alabama High School of Mathematics and Science, and
8	the Alabama School of Fine Arts.
9	"(6) SCHOOL SYSTEM. The schools under the
10	jurisdiction of a local board.
11	"(7) THREAT. A statement of an intention to inflict
12	pain, injury, damage, or other hostile action to cause fear of
13	harm. The intention may be communicated through an electronic,
14	written, verbal, or physical act to cause fear, mental
15	distress, or interference in the school environment. The
16	intention may be expressly stated or implied and the person
17	communicating the threat has the ability to carry out the
18	threat.
19	"\$16-28B-4.
20	"(a) No student shall engage in or be subjected to
21	harassment bullying, intimidation, violence, or threats of
22	violence on or off of school property, on a school bus, or at
23	any school-sponsored function by any other student in his or
24	her school system.

1	"(b) No person shall engage in reprisal,
2	retaliation, or false accusation against a victim, witness, or
3	other person who has reliable information about an act of
4	harassment bullying, violence, or threat of violence.
5	"(c) Any student, or parent or guardian of the
6	student, who is the object of harassment bullying may file a
7	complaint outlining the details of the harassment bullying, on
. 8	a form authorized by the local board, and submit the form to
9	the official designated by the local board to receive
10	complaints at the school.
11	A copy of the form shall be prominently posted and
12	accessible on the website of each local board of education and
13	school, shall be available at each school office, and shall be
14	included in the student handbook that is distributed to each
15	student at the beginning of each school year.
16	"(d) Each school shall develop plans or programs,
17	including, but not limited to, peer mediation teams, in an
18	effort to encourage students to report and address incidents
19	of harassment bullying, violence, or threats of violence.
20	At the beginning of each school year, each school
21	shall programmatically address the issue of bullying and
22	school violence with faculty and students. The program shall
23	include a discussion of available resources and shall

encourage the reporting of incidents of bullying. Each school

shall also periodically convene a committee of faculty and

1	students to review and discuss the issue of bullying and make
2	recommendations to school administrators regarding school
3	climate, safety, and bullying. The local superintendent of
4	education may report any recommendations to the local board
5	for its consideration.
6	"§16-28B-5.
7	"The department shall develop a model policy
8	prohibiting harassment bullying, violence, and threats of
9	violence on or off of school property, on a school bus, or at
10	any school-sponsored function. The model policy, at a minimum
11	shall contain all of the following components:
12	"(1) A statement prohibiting harassment bullying,
13	violence, and threats of violence.
14	"(2) Definitions of the terms harassment bullying,
15	as provided in subdivision (2) of Section 16-28B-3,
16	intimidation, and threats of violence.
17	"(3) A description of the behavior expected of each
18	student.
19	"(4) A series of graduated consequences for any
20	student who commits an act of intimidation, harassment
21	bullying, violence, or threats of violence. Punishment shall
22	conform with applicable federal and state disability,
23	antidiscrimination, and education laws and school discipline
24	policies.

1	"(5) A procedure for reporting an act of
2	intimidation, threat of suicide, harassment bullying,
3	violence, or threat of violence. An anonymous report may not
4	be the basis for imposing formal disciplinary action against a
5	student.
6	"(6) A procedure for the prompt investigation of
7	reports of serious violations and complaints, specifying that
8	the principal, or his or her designee, is the person
9	responsible for the investigation.
10	"(7) A response procedure for a school to follow
11	upon confirmation of an incident of intimidation, harassment
12	bullying, violence, or threats of violence.
13	"(8) A statement prohibiting reprisal or retaliation
14	against any person who reports an act of intimidation,
15	violence, threat of violence, or harassment bullying,
16	including the consequences of and any appropriate remedial
17	action that may be taken against a person who engages in such
18	reprisal or retaliation.
19	"(9) A statement of the consequences of and
20	appropriate remedial action that may be taken against a person
21	who has deliberately and recklessly falsely accused another.
22	"(10) A procedure for publicizing local board policy
23	through publication in the student handbook,, including
24	providing notice that the policy applies to behavior occurring

off of school property and to participation in

25

1	school-sponsored functions, whether the conduct occurs on or
2	off school property, online, or electronically.

- "(11) A clearly defined procedure for students to use in reporting harassment bullying, including, but not limited to, written reports on local board approved complaint forms and written reports of instances of harassment bullying, intimidation, violence, and threats of violence based on the personal characteristics of a student. The complaint form may be served in person or by mail on the principal, or his or her designee, or his or her office. The procedures shall be made known and be readily available to each student, employee, and the parent or guardian of each student. It is the sole responsibility of the affected student, or the parent or guardian of the affected student, to report incidences of harassment bullying to the principal, or his or her designee.
- "(12) A procedure for promulgating rules to implement this chapter, including the development of a model student complaint form. The department shall seek public input in developing and revising the model policy, model complaint form, and any other necessary forms.
- "(13) A procedure for the development of a nonexhaustive list of the specific personal characteristics of a student which may often lead to harassment bullying. Based upon experience, a local board of education may add, but not remove, characteristics from the list. The additional

5	local board and included in the student handbook."
6	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
7	first day of the third month following its passage and
8	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
