each feeder pattern and former Baldwin County graduates working toward a degree in Education. Our Josh Hall Memorial Scholarship recognizes employees and children of our employees who also strive to become teachers. Last year, we were blessed with generous donations which allowed us to give over \$50,000 in scholarships to Baldwin County graduating seniors, former Baldwin County graduates and Baldwin County employees, all who have committed to earn education degrees and become future Baldwin County teachers. We awarded 12 reoccurring student scholarships, four one-time student scholarships and two one-time employee scholarships. To encourage students and employees in various educational endeavors, this year our goal is to exceed this achievement by awarding more reoccurring student scholarships and more employee scholarships.
