There is no maximum number of credit recovery courses that students may take during summer school (except in some cases of athletic eligibility). However, it is recommended that most students plan to take no more than two courses in the summer sessions due to time limitations. This should be a decision made in collaboration with the counselor, student, and parent. Any credit advancement or initial credit courses during summer school will be capped at two attempts.

- *Any requests beyond two attempts should go through the Secondary Curriculum Department and Mrs. Renee Carter, Dean of Academics, for approval.*

\* A middle school student earning credit through Edgenuity must complete every lesson in the semester or course. Students may not opt-out of lessons by successfully completing a pre-test. The final grade in the course is based on the average grade earned after completion of all lessons in the semester or course. If the student is only required to complete one semester, the grade received during summer school will be averaged with the student’s previous passing semester grade. Edgenuity courses are not NCAA-approved.

\*Please note: Admission and eligibility requirement of various organizations are subject to change, and it is the student’s responsibility to consult with outside organizations such as universities, the Alabama High School Athletic Association, NCAA, etc. to determine how credits earned through credit advancement might affect eligibility, admissions, or status. Credit Recovery and Credit Advancement courses are not approved by NCAA.
