Erin's Law was signed into legislation on June 11, 2015, requiring all public schools to provide child sexual abuse prevention to students in grades K-12. School counselors will use the *Safer, Smarter Teens: Personal Power* curriculum to teach students to recognize danger and how to use their personal power to say "no," get help, set boundaries, and become leaders. Students learn about the warning signs of unsafe situations and what actions they can take to reduce risks, stay safe, and access help through scenario-based video lessons and in-class activities. Parents will receive a letter prior to the lesson.
