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7th Grade Elective Descriptions

7th Grade Electives

Cultural Studies

Family and Consumer Science is a course that is designed to assist students in recognizing the importance of the family. Course content provides opportunities for students to explore characteristics of strong families; family customs and traditions; healthy relationships; marriage readiness; parenting issues; consumer behavior; clothing, housing, and food needs throughout the lifespan. Assessing the effects of technology and career options related to family and consumer sciences and human services.

Art

This course will provide instruction on the basic elements of art. Students will explore how to create and produce arts products, relating and connecting them to historical, current and personal events. Students will also have an introduction to history of art.

Drama

Creating, performing, responding and connecting are some of the skills students use to understand how drama communicates ideas and allows for self-expression. Students will study, write and/or perform scenes and monologues. Students will also be introduced to basic history of Drama.

Health

Heath Education is a class that provides the resources that students need to know to live a responsibly healthy life. We will focus on the physical, mental, emotional, social and spiritual aspects of health. You must choose daily to live a healthy lifestyle to stay a healthy individual!

Computer Skills

This introductory course is designed to aid the student in better understanding the function of a computer for school and personal use. Emphasis will be placed on an introduction to Google applications. Internet safety, appropriate search techniques, and the use of word processing and spreadsheet for productivity will also be addressed in this course.

Intro to Spanish

This course is designed for students of all levels of ability. Basic pronunciation, vocabulary, grammar, and culture are emphasized throughout the course.

8th Grade Elective Descriptions

8th Grade Electives

Career Preparedness - A (Credit based elective for High School)

The course prepares students with knowledge and skills in the areas of career development and academic planning and computer skill application. This course is a prerequisite to Career Preparedness-B.

Career Technology 8

This course is part of the Department of Alabama Career and Technical Education, which prepares students for technical careers available today and the future careers in our region. We will study the effects of technology and explore different careers. Students will learn which careers match their interests and aptitude. They will also practice skills needed in the workforce: oral presentations, writing and summarizing, problem solving, teamwork, etc.

Debate

This course will develop and improve public speaking, argumentative, and critical thinking skills in communication settings. Students will prepare and deliver speeches and participate in several of in class debates and forums on current topics. Techniques will be taught to control speech anxiety, and structure and organize information to present to a variety of audiences. As such, the fundamentals of physical and vocal delivery skills, use of language and gesturing, as well as listening skills will be learned. Please note that time requirements are given for each speech.

Drama

Creating, performing, responding and connecting are some of the skills students use to understand how drama communicates ideas and allows for self-expression. Students will study, write and/or perform scenes and monologues. Students will also be introduced to basic history of Drama.

Spanish - Full year Elective (High School Credit)

This course is designed for students of all levels of ability. Basic pronunciation, vocabulary, grammar, and culture are emphasized throughout the course.
