

*Here's how it will work:* 1-2 weeks before your child's birthday download the order form found on the FES website and email or send with your child to his/her teacher. On the day of your child's birthday, send a check or cash for \$15 to the school. The teacher will forward the order



form and payment to the office where it will be filled and kept cold until the teacher sends for it.

If you forget to plan for the birthday, no worries, we can still accommodate you if supplies allow. Simply call the front office. There will be a non-dairy option for classmates with allergies.

#### Dear Parents,

Welcome to the 2019-2020 school year! We are thrilled that you have chosen to partner with us at FES to educate your child.

Connecting each child to books that they love to read so they will read A LOT will be our academic focus this year. This willingness to read a lot because it's interesting will lead to volume reading. Volume reading at home is the key! Research proves over and over that the amount of time students spend reading *out of school* is the biggest predictor of reading achievement. In addition, reading volume is the single greatest factor in reading achievement – greater than socioeconomic status! *This means that getting kids to read at home at a level that is easy for them in a high-interest book is the biggest predictor of reading achievement*. We hope that you will partner with us every day by reading to your child, reading with your child, and encouraging independent reading! Reading at home can be a game changer!

In addition to academics, we will help your child discover and develop his or her unique gifts and talents by using the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People and the Leader in Me. Opportunities to lead will promote self-confidence, responsibility, and initiative. Your child will learn to work cooperatively with others, encourage one another, and synergize.

### How to Change Dismissal for a Student

Changing a child's dismissal involves a lot of folks - front office staff, teacher(s), child(ren), Mom, and Dad. The challenge with one transportation change is to make sure that everyone gets the word. The challenge in a large school with 1100 students is to make sure that A LOT of folks get the word. Welcome School Dismissal Manager! School Dismissal Manager is an online system that informs all parties of transportation changes with a few clicks of a button. This reduces the chance of error. Beginning September 9, FES will begin using School Dismissal Manager for afternoon dismissal changes. The system is easy. Detailed instructions will be coming to you the last week of August. In addition, the Student Handbook, located on the school website, has a section with more specific information about SDM.

Some of you may have specific custodial situations that will need to be addressed on an individual basis. Please contact Mary Elizabeth Brock or Julie Pierce for assistance. We are here to help and are excited about making transportation changes via email.

Between August 14 and September 6, dismissal changes should be made by contacting the front office. Oftentimes, teachers do not check email until after school is dismissed, so please go through the office or send a note explaining the transportation change to your teacher for these first two weeks.

Best Advice - Only change transportation the first weeks of school for young children in case of an emergency to help us minimize the stress of moving 1100 children to their correct dismissal points.

# Week 1 and 2 **REMINDERS**

Parents are encouraged to follow car line procedures and drop students off in the car line and not walk students to the school doors to help ease traffic issues due to lack of parking. *Please review the map in the Student Handbook.* 

Except in case of emergency and approved by administration, *no checkouts are allowed after 2:00 p.m.* 

If you send a lunch to school with your child, *please send it with your student in the morning.* Late lunch deliveries may be dropped off at a pick up table in the office.

Parents may begin eating with students after the first two weeks of school.

# Car-Rider Line SUR VIVALOD

## Morning car rider suggestions:

- Have your child dressed, shoes on feet, fed, and ready to exit the car upon arrival. If you need extra time, please pull off to the side before getting close to the drop off point so others may proceed.
- The first car should pull up to the end of the covered sidewalks. Others should pull up as far forward as possible. PULL UP!!
- K and 1 students exit the car on the passenger side.
  Grades 2 and 3 students exit on the driver side.
  HOV students exit on the driver side. Please have students exit independently as quickly as possible.
- Limit kisses and goodbyes so others can proceed in order to avoid the tardy bell at 7:50 a.m.

### Afternoon car rider suggestions:

- Get your car rider sign for your car from your homeroom teacher. HOV and walker passes will be issued from the gym on August 12 and in the office afterwards.
- The first car should pull up to the end of the covered sidewalks. Others should pull up as far forward as possible. PULL UP!!
- Have your child's name visible until your student is loaded.
- Remain in your car, please.
- Bring a book, magazine, or something to keep you busy while you wait on five years olds to maneuver the car rider line. Lots of emotions are in play for both you and the children. They are all convinced you have forgotten to pick them up!
- Be kind and patient as we try to move the car line along. It will move more smoothly and quickly with time.
- Arrive a bit later to avoid the congestion. If all else fails, have your students ride the bus!
