Our school's ALSDE state report card will be released soon! The formula for calculating a school's success has changed. 85% of the report card is the responsibility of the school, and 15% of the report card is the responsibility of the parent. Missing school impacts a student's

achievement; so, the ALSDE is trying to send the message through the report card. The Fairhope Elementary School yearly grade will be negatively impacted by each child who is

absent 15 or more days. This is the ALSDE definition of chronic absenteeism.

Even if a child has a doctor's note for all 15 absences, our school report card will be lowered.

We are working very hard to improve our academic rigor and are already seeing big results as evidenced by being named one of the top 50 schools in the state for reading academic growth in  $3^{rd}$  grade!



## Volunteer Project to Earn Disney Tickets for Silent Auction

To help earn money for FES and FIS at the Silent Auction in April, we will be auctioning Disney tickets that we earn through volunteer projects. This summer FES sponsored a school cleanup day and we earned 10 one day hopper tickets for the auction. Now FIS is sponsoring a volunteer project on the Fairhope Intermediate campus on December 15, 2018 from 9:00-12:00 – Grow the Garden to Grow the Community!

Teams of 15 -20 will be assigned to one of three areas of need: refurbishing established beds and adding two new beds or growing mounds; weeding and winterizing existing Satsuma trees, and beautifying the West snack area. The mom reminded the child of Habit 3 and the child said, "Oh yeah! Work before play," and happily completed homework first! Many parents are asking for more information about how The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People® can be used at home; so, below are some helpful questions and suggestions.

### Habit 2: Begin With the End in Mind

- Finishing my dinner before eating dessert
- Putting away my toys in the living room before going to play in my bed room
