## Attendance Tied to State Report Card!

The state FES report card was released in December, and attendance rates continue to be a focus. As a governmental entity, schools are required to follow federal, state, and county laws and policies for attendance. Each governing authority has a different threshold when defining chronic absenteeism/truancy. Below are two thresholds:

The Alabama State Department of Education docked every school's report card grade for students who were absent more than 15 days for any reason. This means we were docked for chronic absenteeism for every student who was absent more than 15 days whether it was excused by a physician or not.

Baldwin County Board of Education Early Warning policies begin after 9 absences unless excused by a physician's note. Vacation absences must be included in the maximum of 9 absences. As the year-end approaches and absences begin to mount, please keep in mind, only 9 absences can be excused unless excused by a physician. You can view your child's attendance on Parent Portal or contact the front office or teacher.

There is no maximum allowed number of physician excuses for absences when interpreting the Early Warning law. Please remember to have students in school every day when possible!




