Example of good food items to donate:

- Chili with beans
- Soup
- Fruit (can/cups)
- Cereal (snack size bowls or boxes)
- Cheese crackers
- Other snack food



Attendance Info

- Parents may submit nine (9) notes for student absences. After those nine notes, a doctor's note will be required for all other absences.
- Students who check out before 11:30 are considered absent for the day.
- Notes must be provided for check-outs and check-ins for them to be excused.
- Students are only allowed to make-up work for excused absences.
- Vacation days must be pre-approved by the principal and are included in the 9 parent days students are allowed to take.
- For all absences that are considered unexcused, students will receive a UN in the grade book, which calculates as a 0 for that assignment.
- Students can be retained for having excessive absences.
