Alabama Kindergarten Social Studies Standards Coverage

Week 1: Welcome to School

Students will view and discuss the American Flag and the Pledge of Allegiance. They will discuss friendship and understand that teachers help them learn.

Week 2: Location

Students will learn terms that describe relative location (e.g., near, far, etc.), understand the purpose of maps and globes, and describe the location of places in the school. W.K.3, W.K.6, W.K.7, W.K.8

Week 3: Rules

Students will understand the necessity of rules and the consequences of breaking them. They will identify authority figures at home and school, and discuss the actions of good citizens.

Week 4: Responsibility

Students will learn that a responsibility is a duty to do or not do something and will discuss examples of responsibility and privacy. W.K.3, W.K.6, W.K.7, W.K.8

Week 5: Time

Students will understand calendar time (e.g., days, weeks, months). Students will use words and phrases related to chronology and time. RI.K.1, RI.K.10, RI.K.2, RI.K.3, RI.K.4, RI.K.7, RI.K.8, RI.K.9, W.K.1, W.K.2, W.K.3, W.K.6, W.K.7

Week 6: History

Students will learn that history tells the story of people in the past and things that happened in the past. They will also learn about Christopher Columbus and Columbus Day. RI.K.1, RI.K.10, RI.K.2, RI.K.3, RI.K.4, RI.K.7, RI.K.8, RI.K.9, W.K.1, W.K.2, W.K.3, W.K.6, W.K.7

Week 7: Where Do You Live?

Students will understand that we can describe where we live in many different ways. They will know their own phone number, address, city and state. 10, 8, 9

Week 8: Timelines

Students will understand how to use and create a timeline using words and phrases related to time. They will begin to develop an awareness of primary sources. 1, 1.1, 12, 12.1

Week 9: Needs and Wants

Students will identify the difference between needs and wants and will understand that people work to earn money for things they need and want. 1.1, 12, 12.1, 4, 4.1

Week 10: The First Thanksgiving

Students will learn about the Mayflower's journey to America, the experiences of the Pilgrims, and the hardships of surviving in a new country. 1, 11, 1.1, 12, 12.1, 8, 9

Week 11: Earth

Students will identify basic landforms, bodies of water and cardinal directions. They will explain that maps and globes help locate places. 10, 8, 9

Week 12: Seasons

Students will learn about seasons on Earth and will describe seasonal weather changes. They will understand how weather affects people and the environment. 1, 8

Week 13: Weather

Students will learn about different types of weather and some effects it has on people and the environment. 10, 8, 9

Week 14: Good Citizens

Students will demonstrate ways to resolve conflicts by being good citizens and discuss ways for groups to make decisions fairly. 2, 3, 3.1, 7

Week 15: Maps and Globes

Students will understand that maps and globes help locate places and will differentiate between land and water features. 10, 8, 9

Week 16: Which Way?

Students will learn about cardinal directions and identify basic bodies of water near the United States and in other places on Earth. 10, 8, 9

Week 17: Holidays

Students will learn about some ways people of different cultures and countries celebrate holidays. 6, 8, 9

Week 18: Presidents and Patriots

Students will learn about presidents and other patriotic men and women in the U.S. prior to 1880 (e.g., George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, Harriet Tubman). 1, 11, 1.1, 12, 12.1

Week 19: American Monuments

Students will learn about important buildings, statues, and monuments associated with American history (e.g., the White House, Mount Rushmore). 1, 11, 1.1, 12, 12.1, 8

Week 20: Celebrate America

Students will learn about the way American symbols, holidays, and patriotic activities reflect the shared values, principles and beliefs of Americans. 1, 11, 1.1, 12, 12.1

Week 21: Rights and Responsibilities

Students will discuss the individual rights and responsibilities they have as part of their family, school and community. They will demonstrate the characteristics of a good citizen. 2, 3, 3.1, 8, 9

Week 22: Consumers and Producers

Students will understand the difference between consumers and producers and between goods and services. They will discuss needs and wants and the way people get things they need and want. 1.1, 12, 12.1, 4, 4.1, 5, 8

Week 23: Jobs People Do

Students will learn about work and discuss the jobs people do in their communities. They will describe tools or equipment needed for some jobs. 11, 4, 4.1, 5, 7

Week 24: Money

Students will understand the basic concepts of spending and saving money. They will recognize that U.S. currency comes in different forms. 4, 4.1, 5
